Another letter which arrived from France this week was addressed to Peter Stryker, of Glendale Road, and came from John Ardolino, of Madison.

"In the month of October," the writer says, "we were northeast of Verdun. We made two drives there and gained seven kilometers, 2,100 prisoners, over 200 machine guns and seven cannons. A short time after we were relieved, the armistice was signed. I came through without a scratch but I had quite a few close ones.

"I cannot tell you much of France because where I have been, the towns have nearly all been shelled. The houses are nearly all built of stone and the floors are made of stone. The people wear wooden shoes.

"I am getting along very well in speaking French; but the language changes from one part of France to another so it makes it hard learning. Things are very dear in France. It's pretty hard living for the poor people.

"The Knights of Columbus and the Y. M. C. A. come in very handy. We buy a lot of stuff from the 'Y'."

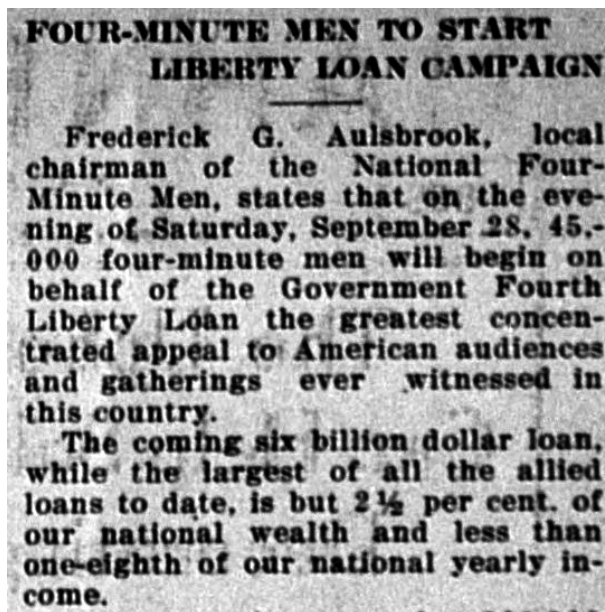

**WRITES INTERESTING LETTER ON CONDITIONS IN SIBERIA**

**Corporal Samuel Barkan Has Served Four Years in Regular Army— Expects Discharge Soon**

Max Barkan, of 5 Park avenue, has received an interesting letter from his son, Corporal Samuel Barkan, who is with the American forces in Siberia. Corporal Barkan has just completed a four-year term of enlistment in the regular army and is expecting his discharge soon. He was stationed in the Philippine Islands before he was sent to Siberia. Before his enlistment he was prominent in school activities here.

Corporal Barkan writes:

"I have been very late in writing but I cannot tell you the reason for it as I do not know myself.

"As you already know I am in Siberia and I suppose you know what kind of a place it is as you have often heard about the Russian people being exiled here.

**Climate Cold But Dry**

"The place where I am now is what they call a city, but in reality it is only a little larger than some of our small towns, and it is made up of hills and valleys. There has been snow on the ground for the last two months and it is the kind that I always wished we had at home, as the climate is dry and so the snow is hard and very good for sleighing. It is cold but we are well clothed and the cold does not bother us very much.

"As to passing our time away in this cold place we drill all day so as to keep our minds on something all the while. The Y. M. C. A. afford us a place where we can spend our time in the evening and so we are not so badly off after all. I feel a lot better here than I did in the P. I, because this is a healthy place if you can keep away from the houses of these people, some of which are dirty and foul. I know of them being that way and so I keep away from the town altogether. There are all kinds of people living here, such as Greeks, Poles, Italians,

Russians, Japanese and most of all Chinese or Koreans.

"I am getting so I can understand the lingo and talk a little, but believe me it is some hard job to make these people understand what you want.

**Now on Reserve List**

"I am getting along very nicely so far and hope to continue that way until I am discharged, which I hope and believe will be soon. The great war is over, or almost as good as over, and I will have served my four years in the army by the time you get this letter and will be on the reserve. So there is a good chance of my being mustered out as soon as the government sees fit.

"I suppose everything is in bloom and people are rejoicing. I certainly would have liked to be over there in the big fray, but I suppose it is just as well, since the war was won without my being there. I would gladly have given ten years of my life to have been home with you to celebrate the day when peace was declared. I bet everybody went mad. I can almost picture

the people laughing and smiling. Gee, but that sure was some day, I bet.

"I was very glad to hear that you were all well and happy and that everything is going right. I am pretty late in sending you a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year, but I was thinking of you at that time, you may be sure of that."

Private First Class **James J. Burns**, of Machine Gun Company, 113th Infantry, has been cited for bravery in action on October 23, 1918, at the Bois D'Etrayes. With characteristic modesty the young man refrained from mentioning the honor which he had received in his letters, until his aunt, Miss Katherine A. Burns, of Woodland road, was informed of it from another source and wrote to inquire if it was true. Private Burns then sent home the citation, which reads as follows:

"HEADQUARTERS

"Blue and Gray Division 29th +

"Private First Class **James J. Burns**,

"M. G. Company, 113th Infantry:

"I have read with much pride the report of the commanding officer of the 113th Infantry regarding your courage and devotion to duty October 23, 1918, at the Bois D'Etrayes, when, though wounded severely, you remained at your gun and later took command of your platoon, replacing a sergeant who had been killed, and I have ordered your name and deed inscribed upon the record book kept at these headquarters for that purpose.

we followed them. They took a town called Cheppy about 7:30 and at a quarter of eight we were in that town.

"The Germans threw over gas shells until hell wouldn't have them. It was all mustard gas, and that is the worst kind there is. When we took off our masks the gas still hung in every little hollow and especially in the dugouts. We all got a whiff of it and I was so very sick that I couldn't eat or sleep for six days.

"I was on post three nights straight, the first night, twelve hours; the second, fourteen; and the third, ten. There were dead all around me and shrapnel screaming and bursting all around, so you can imagine how I felt.

"On the fifth day of the drive we gained fifteen kilometers and the infantry dug in. The general gave orders for every able-bodied man to fall in with a rifle and bayonet and follow him. Our captain kept about ten men which he had to have to get the ammunition and supplies through, and sent the rest of us to help hold the lines. There were mule skimmers, M Ps., headquarters clerks and everything in the trenches. The next morning the Huns made a counter attack but failed and we drove them back farther, capturing nearly everything they had. I was sure sick through all of it, but I did my bit and I know I got more than one Fritz to my credit."

"I have seen some awfully hard times and some good times since I have been over here. There were times when I wouldn't take two cents for my life but I can thank God I got out of it all without a scratch. The only time I felt like dying was in the last drive which our division made in the Argonne Forest. The infantry went over the top at 5:30 and
