


Churches

ST. VINCENT'S FLAG HAS 122 STARS

Catholic Honor Roll Leads the Local Churches in Number of Men in Service.

Last Friday the Eagle published the list of names represented by the forty-six stars on the service flag of the Presbyterian Church. To-day the list of St. Vincent's Roman Catholic names is offered. There are one hundred and twenty-two of them, undoubtedly the largest number set forth by any local congregation, which is only natural, since St. Vincent's is the largest of Madison's congregations.

At the head of the list is the name of John Toomey, who died in Mexico, shortly before the United States entered into the war, but since he took part in a campaign having directly to do with the struggle that followed, the church has placed a gold star for his memory in its flag.

A second gold star represents the late Frank Patterson, who died in Waco, Texas, while in camp.
