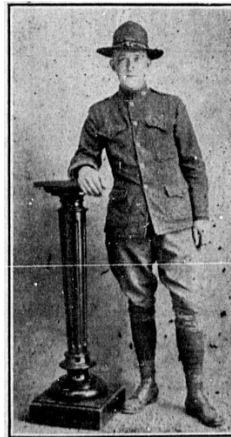

ANOTHER MADISON BOY TO THE FRONT

Charles Dudley, Jr., Left Wednesday to Sail With Ambulance Corps

Madison will be represented in the American Red Cross units that are going to serve in France by Charles P. Dudley, Jr., the only son of Mr. and Mrs. C. P. Dudley, Rosedale avenue.

Some weeks ago when the war enthusiasm swept over the land, Mr. Dudley, who is only twenty years old, and just completing his junior year in Marietta College, Marietta, Ohio, wrote home for permission to volunteer with the Red Cross unit being organized by the alumni of his college, at the instance of B. G. Dawes, a wealthy resident of Chicago, who has two sons in Marietta, one of whom has volunteered. Permission was granted and the college immediately allowed the twenty student volunteers to take their scholastic examinations so that no loss would result from their shortened term.

In the meantime \$25,000 had been raised to finance the party and it was

found that this was sufficient to pay the expenses of twenty-five men for six months. The other five members were secured outside of the college. All volunteered for six months field service in France.

It has not been decided to which branch of the French or British armies they will be attached. On their arrival in France they will be sent wherever most needed.

After a day or two at home Mr. Dudley left Wednesday for New York where he joined other units representing Yale, Princeton and California. All are stopping at the Waldorf Astoria.

This evening they will be tendered a banquet at the Bankers Club, to be given by alumni organizations from their respective alma maters. They have been notified to be prepared to sail at a moment's notice, but the exact hour has not been announced.

Mr. and Mrs. Dudley leave tomorrow to bid their son farewell. The family has only resided here about eighteen months, having come from Parkersburg, W. Va.

A Red Cross corps of nurses will accompany the units.

This makes the third son of Madison to leave for the front, the others are Alfred Skinner and Howard Sayre, and the prospects are that before many weeks have passed a large contingent will go from here to take their places wherever needed.
