DEVITALIS HAS FLOWN FOR THREE ALLIED NATIONS

Former Madison Boy Home From the Front to Join the Aviation Corps of His Own Country

Lieutenant Claudio Devitalis, now of Newark, but until three years ago a Madison boy, is back on his home soil from three years of war, and is probably disappointed that the struggle is over, because he has fought only with France and England and came home expressly to fight for the United States, too.

It was early in 1915, shortly after moving from Madison, that Claudio Devitalis went to Europe as an ambulance driver for the Red Cross. Uncle Sam wasn't in the war then, but the ambulance driver wanted to be, so he joined the French Army's flying corps, won the croix de guerre, and then was transferred to the British flying corps and won the military medal. Even as an ambulance driver he was cited for bravery, so he has received honors from three nations.

Lieutenant Devitalis reached the United States last Friday, for transfer to the United States Army Aviation Corps. He has been slightly wounded several times. He has three brothers in the American Army, Walter with the 101st Field Artillery, a second, William, with the 107th Infantry and a third, Arthur, in the Aviation Corps. His sister, Mrs. Henry P. Day, of Chatham, has been training to be a Red Cross nurse, but now that the war is over she Is afraid she will not be called.

Charles Dudley, Jr., Left Wednesday to Sail With Ambulance Corps

Madison will be represented in the American Red Cross units that are going to serve in France by Charles P. Dudley, Jr., the only son of Mr. and Mrs. C. P. Dudley, Rosedale avenue. Some weeks ago when the war en-

thusiasm swept over the land, Mr. Dudley, who is only twenty years old, and just completing his junior year in Marietta College, Marietta, Ohio, wrote home for permission to volunteer with the Red Cross unit being organized by the alumni of his college, at the instance of B. A Red Cross corps of nurses will accompany the units.

"We are quite a way into Germany, only a few miles from the Rhine. The people here have little to say. If the war had gone on another year, they would have starved. The only thing they have plenty of is potatoes; they have no grease or soap and would do almost anything to get them. The bread they have is black and heavy and not fit to eat. There are no sweets of any kind.

"I was surprised when I read in the Eagle about things in Madison and to learn what people are sick and who have died. Madison got hit pretty hard with the influenza. I haven't heard of any cases of that disease over here yet."

The second letter, which tells of the Christmas dinner given the troops, reads:

"Just a few lines to let you know that I received the Christmas box December 24, and didn't open it until Christmas morning just to make it feel more like Christmas.

You couldn't have put anything better in that box! The chocolate was certainly fine. It was the first American chocolate we had since last Christmas. "There were about a dozen of us fellows together and we all opened our boxes at the same time. They gave me the credit of having the best box—that is, the most to eat, and that was all we were looking for!

"Here's the Christmas dinner we had, and the way we got it: There were fourteen of us together so we went out and bought two ducks weighing about eight pounds apiece. We bought some apples to make pie with and got some potatoes. We had an excook in the bunch who did the cooking, and he did it, too. After the meat courses we had real honest-to-God American apple pie! And for the first time since I left home, so I guess that wasn't so bad for a dinner in Germany."
