ROBERT GARY WRITES AS HE COMES OUT OF BATTLE

Has Fought Prussian Guards, Saxons and Austrians and Finds the Prussians the Toughest

A letter postmarked November 13 from Robert Gary to Police Chief Fred Johnson tells of some hot fighting.

The letter follows:

Dear Friend: Your most welcome letter received. I have just come out of the trenches on the big western front and believe me there was something doing all the time. I have fought against the Prussian Guards, Austrians and Saxons. The toughest of them all are the Prussian Guards for they stick to the last and die at their post. But the Austrians and Saxons give in as soon as they are crowded, and, believe me, that is the time to give them the bayonet or a bullet, whichever you prefer.

I received a letter from mother today with yours and she told me that father was getting stout. A good fight with a Prussian Guard would reduce him rapidly. The boys are falling in for mess and I can't miss that, so I will close. Hoping to hear from you soon and that you are all well. Bob.

DREW STUDENT GOING ABROAD AS FIELD SECRETARY ON FRENCH FRONT

Rev. Hartley Hartman Gives Up Pastorate of Green Village Church and Studies at Drew to Answer Summons of Y. M. C. A. International Committee

MARRIES COLLEGE SWEETHEART TOMORROW

Madison, a call to Rev. Hartley Hartman to go to France as a Y. M. C. A. worker has found him ready to serve the nation in that way. Rev. Mr. Hartman, who for some time past has been pastor of Green Village M. E. Church, has dropped his studies at Drew, where he would have graduated with the Class of 1918, his supervision of the Union Sunday School at South Madison, and the work of directing the activities of the boys at the Central avenue playground. He left Madison on Wednesday for Meadville, Pa., where he graduated in 1915 from Alle-gheny College in the class with Miss.

Janet A. Ellis, his bride of tomorrow. Miss Ellis is the daughter of Rev. Andrew C. Ellis, of 482 Walnut street, Meadville, a retired Methodist minister and at present Associate Editor of the Pittsburgh Christian Advocate. Rev. Mr. Ellis is himself a Drew gradnate, having left the Madison institution about thirty-five years ago. Miss Ellis has taught since her graduation from Allegheny two years ago. The wedding was arranged for late in the wedding was arranged for late in the summer, but was advanced a few weeks because of the fact that Mr. Hartman will probably be called for Y. M. C. A. service before the end of August. The ceremony will be performed at noon tomorrow by the father of the bride and will be informal, at the home of the bride's parents parents.

The call which Mr. Hartman received from the International Committee of the Y. M. C. A. was the result of a telegram sent by General Pershing in France about two weeks ago asking for five hundred young men qualified to act as secretaries of Y. M. C. A. camps in France. The International Committee immediately got in touch with a large number of colleges with departments of social study and asked recommendation of men qualified to fill the position, Mr. Hartman's name was one of those furnished by the president of Allegheny, and early last week there came a telegram signed by Charles D. Hurrey, a secre-tary of the International Committee, asking Mr. Hartman's consideration of the proposition of going to France for the Y. M. C. A. In response to this, Mr. Hartman went to New York

Advancing the date of his marriage | Committee, together with a number of and causing the dropping of all his other men who had been recommended for the work. Speakers with personal experience in war conditions abroad told those who appeared just what they would find if they went to Europe.

After this War Work Council meeting, Mr. Hartman returned to Madison and gave the problem consideration for a day, coming to a decision at the end of that time that the offer of the Y. M. C. A. committee was both a duty and an opportunity. He handed in his resignation to the Playground Committee and left the play-ground work last Friday. He began immediately to make arrangements for supplying the pulpit at Green Village, and secured Rev. Arthur M. Shenefelt, a graduate of Allegheny College, 1917, who is coming to study at Drew this fall. His work at the playground is also being taken care of, and other arrangements he had to make were for the care of the Union Sunday School, and the delegating of someone to give attention to two "war gardens" which he obligated himself to cultivate.

Of the 500 men who will go to act as Y. M. C. A. secretaries in France, a great majority will serve in the army training camps and new cantonments in this country for several weeks before being sent across the Atlantic. When the National Guard army is transported to France many of the newly created Y. M. C. A. field secretaries will also go. Mr. Hartman expects to be assigned to a camp in the South probably in Tares. South, probably in Texas.



LACK OF ACTION AFFECTS SOLDIERS

Richard V. Joyce, Overstaying His Leave, Was Arrested for Desertion

Richard V. Joyce of Main street, a volunteer in Co. F, 1st N. J. Infantry, was arrested here on Sunday morning charged with desertion from the United States army, while on the following morning a military officer from Co. D, 1st N. J. Infantry, came here to apprehend Joseph Burnet, of Hickory Tree, who had overstayed his leave from his company.

Young Joyce appeared in Madison last week. As he made no attempt to conceal himself and was seen about the streets every day his friends naturally thought that he was home again on leave of absence. On Saturday night the police received a request to arrest him from Lieutenant Dager of the First Regiment in Newark. Captain Frederick R. Johnson made the arrest at 2 o'clock Sunday morning and turned the prisoner over to Sheriff Thompson who held him until later in the day when the authorities took him to Newark. With him was another deserter arrested in Morristown.

Joyce's story is that some time ago he came home and overstayed his leave and, when he returned, he was put in the guard house. With three others he escaped through a window at night, and only two have been recaptured.


