Great-Grandson of Veteran of War of 1812 Joins First Regiment in Newark on Sunday

Has His Mother's Blessing

Mrs. Rathbun Has No Sympathy with Pacifists Who Have Brought Blush to Cheek of Motherhood — Flies Flag from Porch

The first Madison youth to enlist in the National Guard which has been summoned for service by the Federal government is Elford Jarnan Rathbun, Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. E. J. Rathbun of Prospect Street and a nephew of ex-Senator Charles A. Rathbun.

Young Rathbun enlisted in Company E, First New Jersey Regiment, on Saturday afternoon and was assigned to his squad on Sunday. On Monday, he left with his regiment for duty in a section of the state not announced on the day of the regimental departure.

Yesterday, a reporter for the Eagle started out to find the young man's mother. He was told to visit Prospect Street, but was not given the number of the house. When he finally got to Prospect Street, however, there was no difficulty in locating the Rathbun home. From one of the houses a faded and tattered flag — a flag that looked as though it had a story — swung from its staff over the sidewalk. Inquiries brought out the fact that the reporter was right at this guess. Mrs. Rathbun lived there and she is not pacifist mother either. She declared she has no patience with those who have brought shame to the mothers of the United States and a blush to the cheek of motherhood everywhere by their appeals to Congress to keep the country from its path of rectitude, duty, and honor because the mothers of America didn't "raise their boys to be soldiers."

With the mothers of England and France giving their boys to the cause of humanity, to the duty of helping to smash the most vicious and tyrannical autocracy in the history of the world, she has no sympathy with the women who shrink for doing their part or who try to influence their sons, husbands, and brothers from doing theirs.

"Yes, my son has enlisted," said Mrs. Rathbun in response to a question. "He said he didn't want to go without my consent."

"Did you make an objection?" she was asked.

"I did not," she replied. "Go if you must," I said to him, "and God bless you."

"Of course, I hated to see him go," she continued, "even if there does not appear at this minute to be a chance of blood being shed here in America. But whatever may be in store for him, I feel that I would have been doing wrong in trying to influence him to stay at home."

Mrs. Rathbun is the type of womanhood which has stood back of its men in every crisis. She is intensely patriotic and comes from a patriotic family. Her grandfather, Thomas M. Sturtevant, enlisted in the war of 1812 at the age of 14 as a drummer boy. He served all through the war and was presented numerous medals for bravery and distinguished service.

Mr. Sturtevant died at the age of 67 and at the time of his demise was the only veteran of the War of 1812 in the State of New Jersey.

"He is the boy's great-grandfather," she went on, "and I am sure he would approve of the course Elford has taken."

And that flag that swung from the staff over the street in front of the house — the only flag out on the street — what about that flag?

"They laugh at me about that flag," said Mrs. Rathbun in response to a look of inquiry, "but I am proud of it."

She unwound its folds tenderly from the staff and spread them out.

"See, it is faded and ragged," she said, "and there are but forty stars. That flag is sixty years old. It has never been in battle, but it belonged to my grandfather and I am proud of it."

Mrs. Rathbun said she considered that the country was facing the greatest crisis in its history. No one could hear her speak and see her eyes flash without recognizing that in her dwelt the spirit of those women of the early days of the Republic, who melted up their pewter pots and pans for bullets for the army of Washington and those women who sacrificed their loved ones without a murmur on the altar of a country's need in the trying days of Civil War.

Her son is placed on the roll of honor in Madison.
