

Last Days of War Busy for Madisonian Fighting With the British, According to Letters Home

Lieutenant Kenneth R. Unger, of the 210th Squadron, Royal Air Force, and a son of Mrs. Alvah W. Osmun, of Madison avenue, has increased his personal score from five Hun flyers to ten, according to letters just received here.

Extracts from the letters follow:
October 30.—"I had some luck yesterday as it was our first offensive patrol on our new front. I had the good luck to shoot down the first Hun, and was very highly complimented by the general who came over to see us that afternoon. I have eight of them to my credit now which isn't so bad for five months out here at the front."

A letter dated November 9 accounts for the two additional Hun machines and describes the writer's adventure with thirty German machine gunners. He writes:

"They had about six machine guns and were just waiting for our infantry to come out into the open from the narrow bit of woods they were passing through, and then mow them down, so down I went, diving at their pits and firing both my guns. Well, the Huns stuck it out for the first two dives but on the third they dropped their guns and ran. I had a beautiful shot." He then goes on to tell of warning the infantry of the Huns' position and the direction in which they are moving. Upon his return to camp he immediately wrote out his report and turned it in "And the next morning the general phoned up and congratulated me on my work. So I was as proud as could be."
